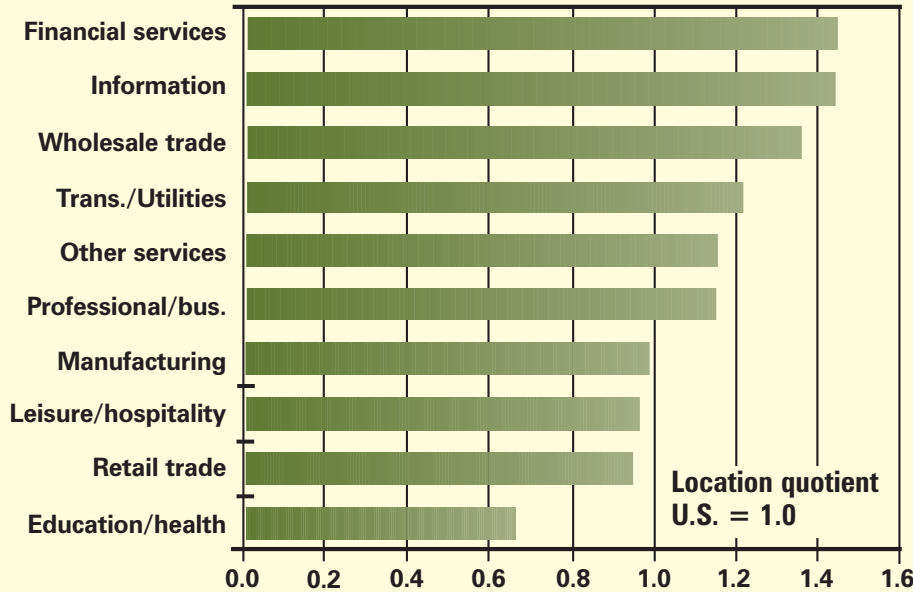

Charlotte economy is a relatively diverse one, with growth supported by a mix of modern services and traditional ones. Financial activities are the largest growth engine and supporting industries, like information, thrive in its shadow. However, even with average exposure to declining manufacturing, services such as transportation and wholesale trade, that normally support production industries, have been able to flourish, accounting for a greater than average share of the economy. Because Charlotte is the largest metro area in the area and sits on good transportation routes, goods distribution and storage are not solely dependent on local production, but on supplying regional retail trade.
